Last month's issue of the PHILA-QUAD was mailed from ALEXIS, Illinois. The town of Alexis is located partly in Mercer and principally in Warren County. Its first postoffice was established on 30 December 1870 under the name of ALEXANDRIA with Orson G. Chapman as its first postmaster. The town was laid out in November Of 1870 in Section 1 of Spring Grove Twp. (Warren County) and Sect. 36 of Suez Twp. (Mercer County). J. E. Alexander was a principal landowner in the area and became the first station agent of the Rockford, Rock Island & St. Louis Railroad being constructed at the time. The name was Changed to ALEXIS on 22 Jan. 1872 with Mr. Chapman remaining as postmaster of Alexis.
