Copernicus has been honored on at least 20 stamps of this his 500th anniversary of birth, he so honored of the world. United States will have a stamp in the issued April 23rd from Washington. It will be a stamp in black. In his hand, he is shown holding a circular globe which helps to explain his theory of the earth moving and not holding still as formerly thought. He is revered as one of the greats.
