AN EDITORIAL

IS THERE SUFFICIENT INTEREST TO SCHEDULE ANOTHER PHILATELIC WORKSHOP?

At the last meeting it was noticeable to many, after the initial ice was broken, there was considerable interest in many subjects on and divisions of philately. Following the meeting, two of our "more advanced Collectors" talked with your Editor and noted that perhaps consideration should be given to another Philatelic Workshop.

It is an established fact that regardless of the number of years a person has been a collector, he will always hesitate to ask a question at a meeting, or from another collector as he has a fear his question might be classed a "silly question." This feeling seems to grow in an even ratio with the number of years this person has been a collector.

Before any plans would be set up, or arrangements for meeting apace made, it is essential to learn if htere is sufficient interest in the project. Those that attended our two previous Workshops will testify the friendly atmosphere quickly puts every one in attendance on an equal footing and each session brings more and more questions. The Workshop continually emphasizes "There isn't such a thing as a 'silly question' in stamp collecting!"

A Workshop will cover a very broad field of subjects. It will not tell anyone WHEN or HOW to collect, but, it will bring out information that will give an expanded amount of help in correcting misinformation or collecting practices. At the completion of one session of our last Workshop, one of the "students" a collector of many, many years remarked That in all his years in collecting he had now learned that he was mounting his stamps in a very improper manner, and, now he could see just why he often encountered stuck-down stamps in his albums.

The Workshop sessions consist of part, test presentation, augmented with baloptican presentation of visual examples of the test, and actual, mounted pages that can be passed to each one attending the sessions. There is always a question and answer period covering the material of the session. A very nominal fee is charged to cover only the actual cost of duplicating the test material of the Workshop. A copy is given to each "graduate" after the last session. If you have interest in a Workshop, please inform our Secretary or the Editor. The only work on your part will be to attend and enjoy the regular sessions.

THE LAST MEETING: The number of events that are always crowded into May, and the exceptional fine weather of the day kept our attendance down to the size of a normal May Meeting.

Wayne Dixon came up with the winning number for a very-fine, mint sheet of the 3-cent Smithsonian issue.

The changed arrangement of the seating area and the bourse tables brought expressed favorable reaction. The dealers will take steps for providing either square covers for the round tables, or their own tablees for future meetings.

The Panel discussion on the show, show judging and stamps in general brought out spirited comments and those present enjoyed a discussion that covered different viewpoints on some subjects. The method of judging disclosed the fact that through an oversight, the point system to be used by the Judging Panel was omitted from the Prospectus. Merwin Gale will duplicate the list of points and copies will be available to all that request them at the next meeting. It was brought out that, altho points were used by the individual judge for his reference in rating each exhibit, EACH EXHIBIT was rated on its own MERITS and not against other exhibits in that particular class. This is the system now used in rhw larger regional and national shows across the n ation. It does result in no gold medals in some classifications and two in another as well as omission of silver or bronze winners. Its main advantage is that a gold award winner in one show will receive a high rating in another show, but there is no assurance that the exhibit will again win a gold award, if another exhibit rates a higher point score. This is one of the reasons The American Philatelic Society inaugurated Judging Standards and the system of Accredited Judges.
