Our Last 2 Meetings

As there was insufficient time between the December 29th meeting and the time the PHILA-QUAD was mailed for January, here is a report on that meeting.

A very fine crowd of over 60 members and guests was on hand for the December meeting that was rescheduled to Tuesday on account of Christmas. This was our last meeting in the Viking Club so they can tear the building down now. The winner in the raffle was Moline's own Al Cabooter; the prize was the stamps that were issued in honor of the armed services at the end of World War II.

The program was again capably handled by Dale Cady. Dale made up a series of displays which were shown on the Baloptican about different aspects of Christmas. Stamps and postmarks about the holiday were included. An excellent example of this close to home was his display centered around the postmark of Joy, Illinois.

Nine days later it was time for our January meeting under the new schedule calling for meetings on the Second Thursday of each month. This time the meeting place was also changed to the brand new Moline Township Hall. When the membership was asked for their opinion of the new quarters, a round of applause was given as the answer. In fact, nothing but complimentary remarks were heard about the hall. There is more space available to us than even the most optimistic board member had thought. It's location, just west of the 7th Avenue Exit of Interstate 74, makes it readily accessible to any part of the bi-state area.

All features of our meetings that we had before are in the new location, even our own kitchen. Mike Lundquist of Moline won the first raffle in the new building.

The program was fine while it lasted. A slide program from the American Philatelic Society was shown, "Stamps of the 1898 Trans-Mississippi Issue". A hitch developed when about at slide 40 of 60 slides the bulb on the projector decided we had seen enough and burnt out. The audience seemed to enjoy that part of the program that was shown. There is another APS slide program on order for a future meeting this spring and we hope the light bulb will co-operate.

In order to mark this occasion, the Quad-City Stamp Club is issuing a cacheted envelope with a photograph of the new Post Office on it. The envelopes will be postmarked in Barstow on the day of the open house. The cost for the stamped, cacheted and cancelled cover is 40¢ each or 3 for \$1.10. They will be available during the open house hours, 2 to 5 PM and at our March meeting. They are also available by mail from Steve Bahnsen, 1712 - 7th Avenue, Moline, IL 61265.

The Club appreciates Barstow Postmaster Lois Lanier's excellent co-operation in this matter. She has been all for this idea from the word go. This new building is a tremendous improvement over the former Post Office quarters. Come on out and look the place over.
