Walt Green again awarded his Philatelist of the Year trophies. This year he had no applications or judges; he made the selections himself. The Senior Award went to someone who aids collectors every day even though she doesn't herself collect - Jane Castner, President of River City Stamps. The Junior Award went to a young girl who was one of the victims of the Welton, Iowa explosion during the 4H meeting - Sara Mc Dermot. Congratulations Jane and Sara - Philatelists of 1981.

Thank you are in order for all of you who attended and bid so generously. Word was given out to several collectors who may become new members of the QCSC that we exist, -- we received a plug from both Dale Cady and Jack Wills. Thank you are also in order for the number of people who helped run the auction, and it ran smoothly, as usual. Those who worked were: Jane Castner and Mrs. Power, cashiers; Jack Wills and Warren Power, auctioneers; Bob Ofner and Chuck Maki, recorders; Don Hayes, Brian Hayes, Roland Edlund and his son, coordinators. Thank you go to those who helped before the auction began, those who donated, spent time preparing the lots and a fellow by the name of Dick Castner who came up with the idea a few years ago.

There is only one more chapter to be written regarding the 1982 Cancer Auction - the presentation of the money. Representatives from the Scott and Rock Island County Cancer Societies will be at the April QCSC meeting to accept the checks.
