QUAPEX '82 Silent Auction

The silent auction might be called or related to a swap & shop or a white elephant sale. It provides a procedure for us to sell our duplicates and gives us an opportunity to purchase articles we have been seeking. In addition it develops some revenue for our club.

I will provide "Bid Sheets" that include space for the seller's name, Scott#, Condition, Value and Minimum bid. The sheet also has places for a number of bids. Anyone wanting to buy the article simply writes his name on the bid sheet along with his bid. Another person then will write in a higher bid on the next line if he wishes to bid more. This procedure continues until the auction is declared closed; then the item goes to the highest bidder.

The club will receive 10% of the sale price. At present we are planning two sales on Friday and three on Saturday and Sunday. Your material can be prepared beginning now; I will have bid sheets with me at the June meeting. You may also wait until the show to enter your lots. Material left for the auction will be claimed at the close of the show if not sold. The sale is open for members only to sell and reimbursement will be made by check after the books have been tallied. Any person attending the show will be eligible to purchase the lots.

Several volunteers will be needed to help; contact me if you wish to assist. Remember that this is a new venture for us and probably should not be judged on the first year's performance. It is a popular event in some areas, but it takes time to develop.

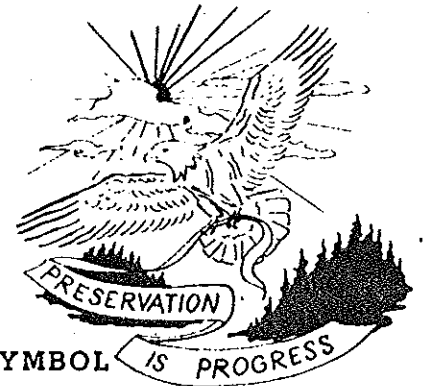
