October 8-10 at the Davenport Masonic Temple, Host to TMPS

That headline fairly well announces your Club's upcoming stamp exhibition and bourse. Your show has been in the planning stages for over a year now and it will be in this final month that all the pieces are put together. On this page and the following one, we will mention various aspects of QUAPEX.

To begin with, QUAPEX is being held in the Masonic Temple, Brady and Seventh Streets, in Davenport, Iowa. For the first time in many years, we are having a three day show in the Quad-Cities. The show hours are 2:00 PM to 7:00 PM on Friday and 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM on both Saturday and Sunday.

QUAPEX is hosting the 49th Annual Meeting and Convention of the Trans-Mississippi Philatelic Society (TMPS for short). This group is the third largest general philatelic organization in America with several members in the Quad-Cities. TMPS will have their Board of Directors meetings on Friday and Saturday afternoons and their Annual Membership meeting (open to all TMPS members) at 10:00 AM Saturday. This is the first time since 1953 that we have hosted the TMPS Annual meeting; the QCSC is Chapter 30 of TMPS.

QUAPEX is first of all a stamp exhibition. To be frank, we need your exhibit as Tim Kargl reports entries are quite slow this year. All members received an entry blank with a PHILA-QUAD this spring. If you've mis-placed that one or need another, just contact Tim as he has several.

This year's show will feature an awards banquet on Saturday night. It will be held at 7:00 PM in the Quality Inn Motel which is located adjacent to the Masonic Temple. Joe Prior and Irwin McLaughlin are in charge of arrangements for this buffet style dinner. The cost is \$7.00 and tickets will be available from Joe or Mac at the September meeting. Everyone is invited to this dinner and we hope many members will attend.

Stamp dealers will be there in quanity. The bourse is filled by 24 dealers from several states. In addition, the TMPS Sales Circuits will be available at their own table.

An area that everyone can help with is setting up and taking down the exhibit frames. Loryann Eis is in charge of these operations that will begin at 6:00 PM Thursday, October 8th. The more people that help, the sooner the work is finished. Also don't forget to help take down the exhibits on Sunday after the show closes.

A new feature of QUAPEX will be silent auctions. They will be held on all three days. Any member can sell items in these auctions; the Club gets a 10% commission. Red Reed is heading up this department. You may see him for details at the meeting or give him a call in Galesburg at 309/343-6337.

We will have 3 different cacheted envelopes at QUAPEX, each featuring an individual connected with the Black Hawk War. Presidents Lincoln, Davis and Taylor are shown. These will be sold for 50% each at the show. Chuck Maki designed the cachets and Joan Pritzlaff designed the pictorial cancellation that will be in use at QUAPEX. The Davenport Post Office will be on hand with the latest in commemorative stamps.

Make plans now to attend and bring your friends. This is your show and your club - they both need your help to be a success.
