April Meeting

The highlight of the April meeting was the presentation of the checks from the Seventh Annual Cancer Auction. Pat Sears, Crusade Chairperson from Scott County and Pauline Lehne, Board Member of the Rock Island County office were on hand to receive the checks and to have their picture taken with Steve and myself. That picture was in the Moline Dispatch the Saturday after our meeting.

The actual total given turned out to be \$20 more than originally announced. A lady came by River City Stamps a day or so after the acution and made the \$20 donation. The total given this year was \$6484 -- \$3242 to each group.

After a discussion outlining a proposed plan from the Board of Directors, the club voted to move the Annual White Elephant Auction from June to October. The main reason for the move being our not wanting to create competition for the Cancer Auction. The motion was made by Frank Hensler and seconded by Ted Ubbelohde. The vote was unanimous.

Dale Cady gave the report of the nominating committee. The present President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer are running again, unopposed. There are, however, three people running for two seats on the Board. These people are: Ted Ubbelohde, Charles DCamp and C.V. Simon. We will have a secret ballot, where each member has two votes, at the May meeting. As per the Constitution and By-Laws, no further nominations can be accepted after the April business meeting.

Vera Griffin gave a presentation especially for our Juniors. Her words of wisdom included such things as: be sure to rinse your stamps well before drying; let them dry a little before you press to finish the job; use a loose leaf notebook and plain paper for your album and start with definitives. By the way, Vera challenged us all to find out why we refer to regular issues in that way. She concluded her talk by giving each of the young people present an album sized stock page to keep and sort their stamps with.

BITS AND PIECES
