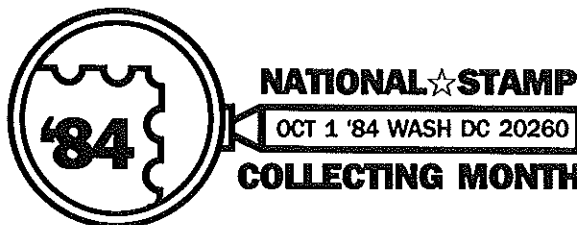

Constitution Review Committee's Revisions Approved by Board

After several meetings over the summer, the role of the Constitution Review Committee seems to be winding to a close with the Board's approval of the changes on September 25th. This committee, Susan Hayes, Ted Ubbelohde, George Holmes, Irwin McLaughlin and Myrtle Sheets; has made a few amendments and many grammatical and technical wording changes. Surely you found the four additional pages to this newsletter as soon as you opened it. The Board felt it was important to list all changes for you, no matter how small. Here is the only change in the Constitution; changes in the By-Laws are listed on pp. 2a-2d.

ARTICLE V

CONSTITUTION

Revision

An official publication shall be issued at designated times and circulated to all members in good standing. The publication of any official notice in that official publication shall constitute official notice to all members-in-good-standing.

Delete the second sentence, but revise the first to read with the following addition; ;that publication constitutes official notice.

ARTICLE I - MEMBERSHIP

Section 2. The annual dues shall be two (2) dollars annually or in such sum as the Board of Directors shall determine from time to time.

Rewording: The annual dues shall be such a sum as the Board of Directors shall determine from time to time.

ARTICLE II - OFFICERS

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall be the governing body of the Club, under the guidance of the President. The Board of Directors shall be composed of nine (9) elected officers and directors, and one (1) non-elective officer. The President shall automatically become Immediate Past-President at the termination of his duty as President.

Clarification: add who is the Editor of the Club's official publication after the one (1) non-elective officer.

Section 2. The PRESIDENT shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Club. He shall preside at all meetings of the Club membership and meetings of the Board of Directors. He shall appoint all non-elective officers and all Standing or Special Committees and be an ex-officio member of all appointed committees.

Delete all Standing or Special and appointed.

Section 3. The IMMEDIATE PAST-PRESIDENT shall assist the President and shall perform the duties of the President during his absence or inability to attend official meetings of the Club, or the Board of Directors, and shall perform such additional duties as may be delegated to him by the President.

Delete, or the Board of Directors,.

Section 4. The VICE-PRESIDENT shall assist the President and shall perform the duties of the President at Official Meetings at which neither the President nor the Immediate Past-President is able to attend.

Delete at following Meeting. Reduce Official Meeting to lower case. Change meetings of the Club Membership to Club meetings.

He shall be the PROGRAM CHAIRMAN to select and present programs of his choice at all regular, scheduled meetings of the Club Membership. He shall select such members deemed necessary to aid him with the Club's meeting programs.

Section 5. The office of SECRETARY-TREASURER shall be held by one person. He shall keep accurate record of all finances and official proceedings of the Club; shall receive all applications for membership and submit them to the Board of Directors and to the Club members at a regular, scheduled meeting, for acceptance. He shall see that the names of all new members are published in the Club's official publication; keep an up-to-date membership list; collect membership annual dues and any financial obligations to the Club; make deposits of all income in a bank or banks approved by the Board of Directors; make payments for expenses of the Club, as approved by the President; submit annual membership and financial statements at the close of each fiscal year, and see that condensed statement of these reports be published in the Club's official publication.

Section 7. There shall be six (6) DIRECTORS, whose terms of office shall be three (3) years, and so arranged that only two (2) Directors shall be elected each year. A replacement of any Director shall serve only the remaining portion of the term of office of the replaced Director.

Section 8. The terms of office of the President, Vice-President and the Secretary-Treasurer shall be one (1) year.

ARTICLE III - MEETINGS

Section 3. A QUORUM at any regular, scheduled meeting of the Club, for the transaction of Club Business shall be twenty (20) or more members in good standing. A quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall be five (5) or more.

Add and report at the Board of Directors meeting after ...record all finances and official proceedings of the Club. Delete, and to the Club members at a regular, scheduled meeting, for acceptance. Delete as approved by the President and add when authorized by the Board of Directors, with the exception of auction monies, postage and printing costs of the official publication of the Club and rent payments which may be paid when due.

Section 8.
The terms of office of the President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be two (2) years. The President and Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected in odd numbered years and the Vice-President in even numbered years. A replacement for any Officer shall serve only the remaining portion of the term of office of the replaced Officer.

Section 3. A QUORUM at any regular, scheduled Club meeting, for the transaction of club business, shall be twenty five (25) per cent of the members in good standing. A quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall be five (5).

Section 2. The President shall name the Chairmen, with the approval of the Board of Directors, of the following Standing Committees: Nominating, Reception and Hospitality, Publicity, Recruiting and Membership. Each Committee shall be composed of the number of members agreeable to the Chairman and the President.

Section 3. The President shall appoint an AUCTION MANAGER, with the approval of the Board of Directors. The Auction Manager shall solicit auction material from the members. The commission shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. The Club President shall appoint an AUDIT COMMITTEE, consisting of no more than three members, for the purpose of auditing the Club accounting records on an annual basis. Such an audit will normally be conducted after the annual election of the Secretary-Treasurer. Interim audits may be required should a change in Secretary-Treasurer take place prior to the annual election.

ARTICLE V - REMOVAL FROM MEMBERSHIP OR OFFICE

Section 1. Any member or Officer may resign from membership in the Club on written notice to the Secretary.

Section 2. Any member or Officer may be removed from membership or office for cause. The Secretary shall prepare a statement listing the reasons for removal, which shall be presented to the Board of Directors. Removal action by the Board of Directors shall require the approval of two-thirds of the members of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The President shall appoint a Nominating Committee prior to the regular March Club Meeting for the purpose of making nominations to the Club members for the election of new officers. The Committee shall select one or more names for each elective office. A report of the Committee shall be presented to the Board of

Nominating Committee in the first sentence should be in all capitals. No capitals on committee and meeting when used. No comma after following the committee's report.
Delete regular before March. Change each reference to meetings to read March/April/May/June Club meeting as appropriate.

Directors prior to the April Club Meeting, and if approved by the Board of Directors, shall be presented to the membership at the April meeting. Nominations may be made by a member or members for additional officers, following the report of the Nominating Committee. Consent of the nominee or nominees must be obtained. No further nominations will be accepted following the Committee's report, and any floor nominations. The report of the Nominating Committee shall again be read at the May meeting and shall include any and all additional nominations made at the April meeting. Balloting on unopposed candidates may be taken by voice vote of the members present. Any office having more than one candidate shall require a vote taken by secret ballot. A simple majority of the votes cast shall constitute the election of any candidate. The results of the election shall be announced prior to the closing of the business section of the May meeting. The newly elected officers will take office at the close of the business section of the June meeting.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Amendments to these By-Laws may be made at any regular, scheduled Club meeting after approval of the Board of Directors, and a reading of the proposed amendment at the Club meeting, followed by a second reading at the next regular, scheduled meeting. Approval of a proposed amendment shall require a three-fourths majority vote of the members-in-good-standing at the meeting.

Section 2. The Secretary will cause copies both the Constitution and By-Laws be printed in sufficient quantity to provide each member with a copy plus an ample supply of copies for distribution to new members of the Club. Copies will be distributed to those members that are present at the first available meeting after the printing is completed. Any member not able to attend any regular meeting for some months may apply for his copies by writing to the Club's Secretary, requesting such action.

Revision: Change to two-thirds majority to coincide with Amendments to the Constitution. Add Club after scheduled. There should be no hyphens in the phrase members in-good-standing.
