1905-1986

This will be a new type of writing for me--a eulogy--for Dale Cady, who died April 23, 1986. It will not be difficult since there is no shortage of good things to say about Dale.

It was in 1971 that I first met him. This was shortly after my admission to this Club. Someone told me Mr. Cady collected postmarks. Truer words were never said. Our collecting interests were similar in content if not in form. Dale collected cancels any way he could; I'm fussy and want them a certain way. Dale collected used stamps as they came along; I'm a mint man all the way.

Dale was President of our Club in 1957 and again in 1981. Given that time span, doesn't that tell you something about the man? Especially before his stroke, and to a lesser degree afterwards, Dale acted like he was 40 years old. He was go-go-go all the time. How we all looked every month at the "Odd, Strange and Different" frame he brought to the meetings. Dale enjoyed stamp collecting and wanted everyone else to do the same.

The best way for Dale and I to spend a day was to travel around to different Post Offices. He got me started on this and now I can't stop. You'd meet some of the nicest people ever and how we both loved the scenery in Iowa and Illinois. Try as I might, I can't come up with one "top" story of our post officing days because there are just too many of them. Dale was at home in Chicago with 3 million people or Cooper with 50 people. There were stamps and cancels in both places. He enjoyed mailing the PHILA-QUAD each month so this issue is dedicated to Dale.

To Helen Cady, Dale's wife of 54 years, we extend our sympathy. You are always welcome in this Club. We will remember Dale Cady for a long time in our group as a friend and collector.

Rules for Exhibitors

1. QUAPEX is an open show, anyone may exhibit. All exhibits must be owned by the exhibitor.
2. Each entry must be on a separate entry blank which accompanies these rules. A person may enter as many different exhibits as desired provided a separate entry blank is filled out for each entry and subject to the availability of frames.
3. The exhibition frames will accommodate six (6) 8½ x 11 pages (two rows horizontal and three in each row.) Total viewable space inside the frames is 23¼ by 27¼ inches.
4. Entry fees are \$2.00 per frame for Adults, 50¢ for Juniors 18 and under.
5. CLASSIFICATIONS

Class A United States	Class E. Foreign
Class B Airmail	Class F Revenues
Class C Postal History	Class G Miscellaneous
Class D Topicals	Class H Juniors
Class I Items of Philatelic Interest-Not Judged	
6. All entries must be submitted to the Exhibit Chairman so as to arrive not later than October 1, 1986.
7. Exhibits must be shipped prepaid to the Exhibit Chairman so as to arrive not later than October 14, 1986 unless prior arrangements have been made. Individuals may assist in the set up of their exhibits on Friday, October 17th from 6 to 10 PM. Failure to exhibit forfeits entry fee.
8. No exhibit may be removed from the frames before the close of the show Sunday, October 19, 1986 at 4:00 PM.
9. All exhibits not picked up by the exhibitor at the close of the show will be returned to the exhibitor by First Class Mail uninsured at no cost. If alternate methods of return are desired, instructions and funds must be remitted to the Exhibit Chairman at the time of entry.
10. Due care will be taken to guard all exhibits. However, no responsibility shall be attached to the QUAD-CITY STAMP CLUB or the MASONIC TEMPLE or any of their members or employees for damage or loss of any exhibit or part thereof. Exhibitors must provide their own insurance if desired.
11. Judging will be made on the following (in the order of importance): Philatelic Knowledge and Research, Presentation and Interest, Condition, Completeness, Scarcity. Decision of the judges will be final and not subject to appeal.
12. AWARDS Classes A - H will be judged. Class I will not be judged. There will be a Grand Award for the best in the show. First, Second and Third Place awards will be given at the judge's discretion. The Dale Cady Award will be given for the best United States exhibit by a Quad-City Stamp Club member. The Tim Kargl Award will be given for the best foreign exhibit by a Quad-City Stamp Club member. Special awards will be available from various philatelic societies. All exhibitors will receive a Certificate of Entry.
