QUAPEX '85 was arranged on the assumption that our facilities were to be one price and then we found they had been doubled. We were fortunate to have found this out before it was too late to cancel.

QUAPEX '86 returned to the Masonic Temple at prices similar to what was planned in 1985. We felt we needed this much space and we have had two day shows for many years. Somewhere along the line we were wrong. As of the June deadline we had only a few dealers' tables spoken for and not much happened over the summer to make the picture any brighter.

After a painful Club meeting, the Board voted we must cancel this show, reevaluate our expectations and try for another show as soon as possible. All of you are being asked to help in some way with this process.

September Program on Exhibiting

Last month George Wolters was prepared to give a presentation on exhibiting, but due to the length of the discussion concerning the show we never got around to it. We will have it this time instead. Even though this show has been canceled, another QUAPEX is in our future.
