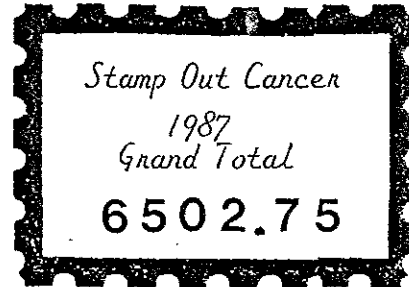

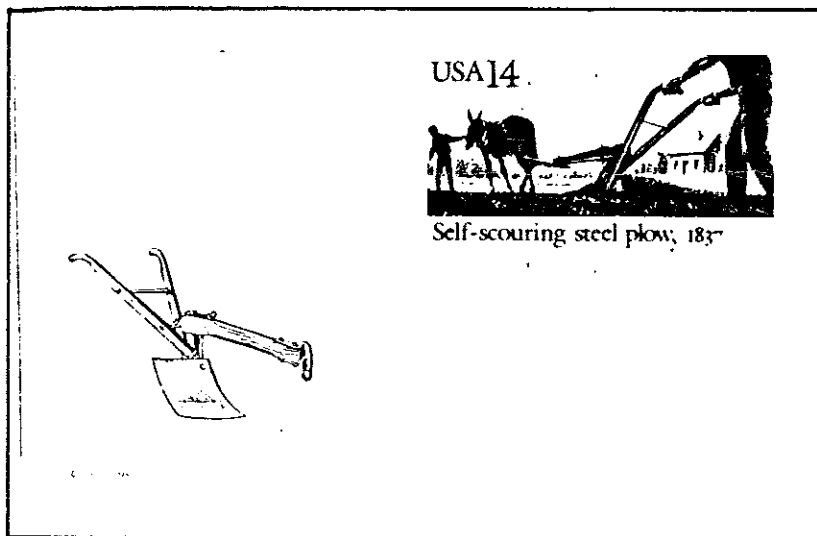

Illustrated at the left is a miniature of the postal card to be issued in our area on My 22nd.

This is the 150th anniversary of the plow's invention as well as the 150th anniversary of the John Deere company.
