

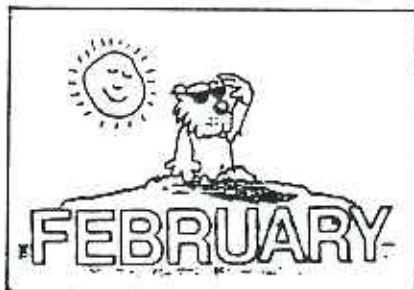

Let's Stamp Out Cancer!

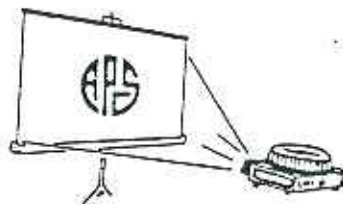
