§§ RULES §§

1. Not more than TWO album pages may be entered in any category; page size 10" by 11" or smaller.
2. Exhibitors may enter as many different categories as desired.
3. Judging will be by popular vote or by a judging panel, as appropriate.
4. An award will be given in each category.
5. Please put your name on the back of each sheet to aid in their return.
6. Enter your exhibit the evening of MAY 12TH prior to 8 p.m.

CATEGORIES - Rated by 3 Judges:

- A. United States Stamps - postal issues
- B. Foreign Stamps - postal issues
- C. Best coverage of any one stamp or set of stamps
- D. Best presentation of any country of Non-Postage items

- Rated by Popular Vote:

- AA. Most attractive commercial page and contents
- BB. Most attractive non-commercial page and contents
- CC. Best presentation of a topical subject
- DD. Juniors only - any area

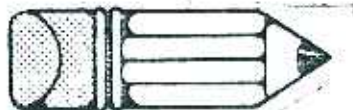
