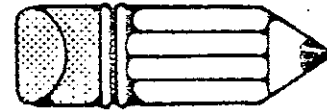

OMAHA STAMP SHOW SITE OF FDC

25¢ HONEYBEE COIL ISSUED SEPTEMBER 2, 1988



Omaha's annual show had a special highlight this year. The event was begun with the release of a new stamp. Postmaster Anthony M. Frank was on hand to dedicate the stamp a first-day ceremonies on September 2nd. During the three day event a presentation on the hive and honeybee stamps was given by Ken Preuss of Lincoln, Nebraska. A live observation of honeybees was also scheduled. Two cachets were available, one featuring a honeybee.

Honeybees are one of the hardest working and most important insects on the face of the earth. In the United States alone honeybees produce about 200 million pounds of honey each year. In addition bees are invaluable for pollination of fruit trees and other crops. It is estimated that 3.5 million acres of crops in this country depend on insect pollination. About 90% of insect pollination is performed by honeybees.
