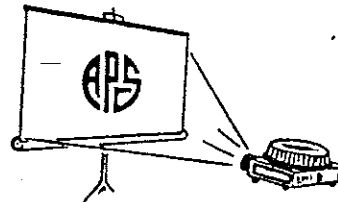

FINAL REPORT

We are happy to report another successful auction has been accomplished. Soon the committee will be back at work preparing statements of prices realized for all those who donated and setting a date for the 1990 event.

While the auction was successful, the total raised is somewhat lower than in the past years. This year's total is \$3100.90 or \$1550.45 for each county, Scott County, Iowa and Rock Island County Illinois. We expect to have representatives on hand to present the checks to at the April meeting.

There are still some expenses yet to be met and only \$15 or so left in the bank of donations. If you would like to assist with these costs, we will have the can available again at the next meeting. If you would like to contribute more to the Cancer Society, you can also do it in this way because any excess money will be added to the auction receipts and divided between the two counties.

On behalf of the committee, we extend to you our thanks for you support and assistance in helping make this event another success. We look forward to 1990. We have now raised over 12 years \$55,137. Let's aim for a total of \$60,000 by the time the totals are in from the 13th auction.

## Nominating Committee

Those people going off the board are the President, Secretary/Treasurer and the two board members who are serving as the nominating committee.

Officers serve two year terms with the exception of the directors who serve three year terms. If you want any explanation as to what is expected of the officers, ask the nominating committee or the outgoing officers.
