

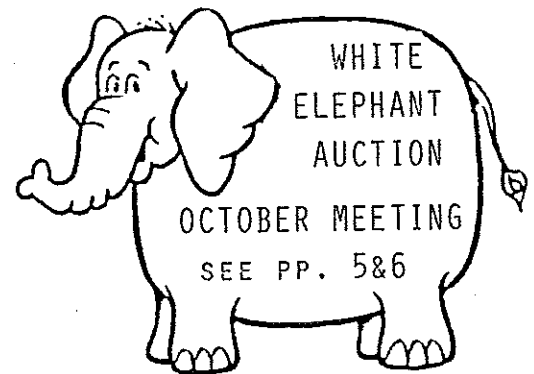

SPECIAL CANCELLATION

The pictorial cancellation from Oregon, IL features the Indian statue near there. The majestic statue stands on a high bluff overlooking Rock River. The statue is over forty feet tall and is made of reinforced concrete. The statue was done by the famous sculptor, Lardo Taft and was completed in 1911.

Taft considered the statue to be an idealized figure of the American Indian, but over the years became known as Black Hawk Statue.

The cachet is a collage of the other recent Indian stamps from the Great Americans series.

LINCOLN NEBRASKA IS PROUD OF NEAL R. ANDERSON

The rotunda of the Nebraska State Capitol Building was the setting for the July 1, 1989 First Day of Sale Ceremony, held at 10:00 a.m. to honor the artist. A standing room only crowd overflowed the seating that filled the beautifully decorated rotunda. Each person signing the guest book was given a program, printed courtesy of Wild Wings, Lake City, MN.

The main address was delivered by Norma Opgrand, Coordinator, Federal Duck Stamp Program. An emotion filled Neal Anderson responded with "I am speechless" as he stood at the conclusion of the program.

At 11:00 a.m. the duck stamp went on sale at the Blue-bill Station in the atrium of the Cornhusker Hotel. The Lincoln post office gave away a cacheted envelope in unlimited quantities. Many affixed the duck stamp and postage to it to obtain the station cancel.

An invitation only luncheon honoring the artist was held at noon in the hotel ballroom. The program after the luncheon held many surprizes for Anderson. It started with a special video greeting from Manuel Lujan, Jr., Secretary of the Interior. More than twenty religious, service and civic organizations presented gifts of thanks to Neal Anderson for his support over many years with donated art work that was sold or raffled by the groups. A bit of fun and humor was provided by Dick Cavett, a surprize guest at the luncheon.

After the luncheon Neal Anderson demonstrated why he is so well liked in Lincoln by sitting at a table and signing anything that anyone wished for as long as there were people requesting his autograph.

To complete the day I attended an evening gala held at the Knolls Country Club. This was open to anyone who desired to attend.
