

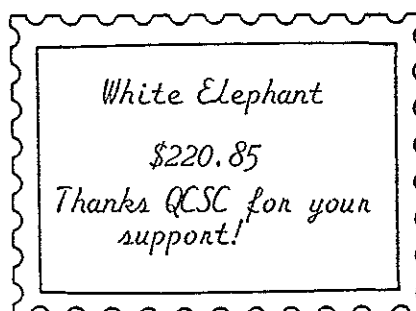

SPECIAL NOTICE

Auction Manager, George Wolters announced at the October meeting that as of the November auction the material will be priced at the 1990 catalog prices. In other years this may not have made any difference, but this is not any other year.

The 1990 catalogs have been reworked to reflect a retail price. It used to be that one could expect to pay 50% of the catalog price for foreign stamps, but now dealers are asking the full price. In many cases this means that the price is half of what was listed previously, but they may have remained the same.

It is important that you be aware that a larger percentage of the value will be expected than before. Do not embarrass our consigners by underbidding drastically. If we expect to continue to get material to auction, it is important that we keep this catalog change in mind.

If you do have something currently valued at \$15.00 or over, you have the right to put a minimum bid on the lot. If no one will bid your minimum, the lot is returned to you.

BOURSE REPORT

Attendance at the bourse was not very good, much as the one in February. We are planning some new advertizing tactics where we will be using flyers sent to dealers, collectors and clubs as well as making them available at as many other philatelic events across the midwest as possible. Our next bourse is scheduled for October 28, 1990 to allow time for adequate institution of our new methods. More on this later.

There were 64 people registered at the bourse. One dealer did not use his table and there was so little business that we closed up early. Due to increased newspaper costs, the bourse shows a loss of \$65.33. Bear in mind, we never planned a profit and that we should not consider a loss a failure. Thanks to all of the members who helped out, we sure appreciate each and every one of you.

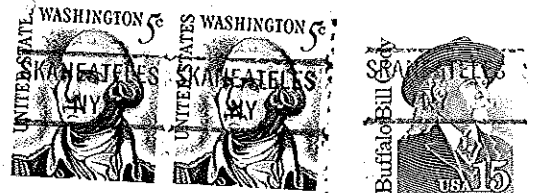
