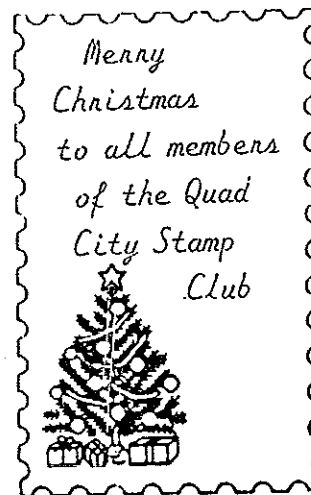

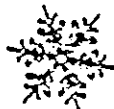

1990 U.S. Stamp Program

There are already thirty six stamp issues currently scheduled for this coming year. Some of the highlights include: a stamp to honor the centennial of Eisenhower's birth, a joint issue with the Federated States of Micronesia and Marshall Islands and four marine animals that will probably be the feature of the National Stamp Collecting Month promotion.

If next year is any indication, there seems to be a trend toward booklets. There are four planned for release: 5 lighthouses, 5 Olympians, 5 Indian headdresses and a post card rate booklet(see below).
