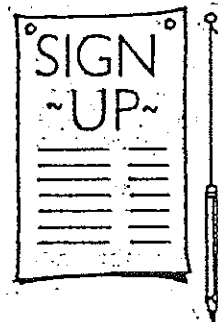
QCSC PLANS FALL SHOW

We have arranged to rent the Rock Island Masonic Temple for a show on October 28th. We plan to have a bourse as before, but we will also be having an exhibit.

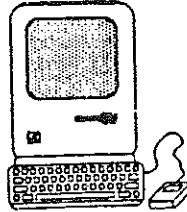
