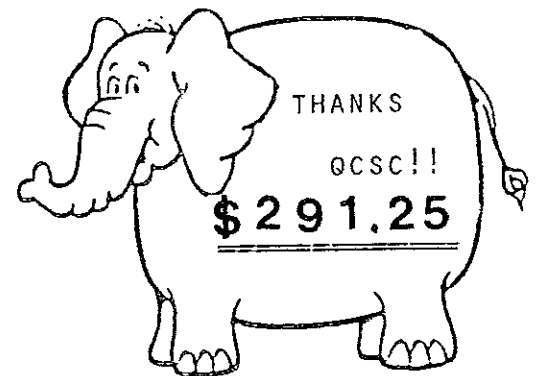

PROPOSED BY LAWS CHANGE

You may recall that we have mentioned before that we have been having trouble obtaining a quorum for some of our Board meetings. Normally this means four of us have made the effort to attend and five are needed to conduct business. The reasons for these absences are many, usually work or being out of town is the reason.

The Board proposes that the following change be made so we will be able cope with the problem:

ARTICLE III - Meetings, Section 3: ...A Quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall be five (5).

CHANGE TO READ: ...Those members present at a Board Meeting shall constitute a Quorum.

Our By Laws state that this ammendment should be read at the next two regular Club meetings. Approval of the change shall require a two-thirds majority of the members at the meeting.

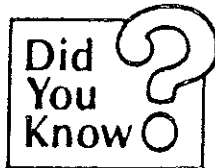

Instruction for obtaining FDC's: Collectors are encouraged to purchase stamps and affix them to their own covers and then sent to the Postmaster of the first day city within 30 days of issue addressed as follows: Customer-Affixed Envelopes, Name of the Stamp, Postmaster, City, State, ZIP Code followed by -9991. If you wish for them to affix the stamps you must include proper postage and be prepared to wait. Already prepared covers are given priority. Address to: Name of Stamp, Postmaster, City, State, ZIP Code followed by -9992.

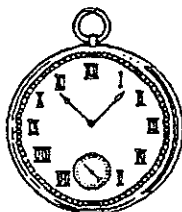
