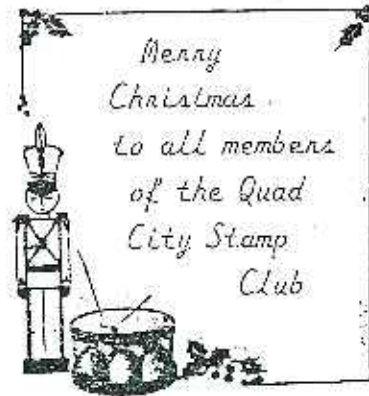

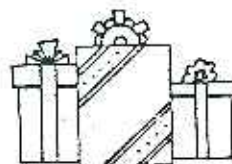


December Program ?

Proposed By Laws Change

The QCSC Board proposes that the following change be made:

ARTICLE III - Meetings, Section 3: ...A Quorum for a Board of Directors meeting shall be five (5).

CHANGE TO READ: ...Those members present at a Board Meeting shall constitute a Quorum.

CHANGE TO READ (by vote of members present at the November meeting): ...A Quorum for a Board of Directors Meeting shall be three (3).

This change from the recommendation will be read and voted on at the December Club meeting as per the provisions of the By Laws.

Reminder: The catalog value currently shown is from the 1990 catalog, which reflects a true retail price. Members continue to bargain hunt and try to buy far below catalog value. The members who complain about the low prices realized are frequently those who are pleased when they successfully "steal" a lot themselves. If we truly want to encourage good auctions, then it is up to the buyers to respect the consigners by offering a fair price.

STAMP SHOW

We are happy to report that our show of October 28 at the Rock Island Masonic Temple was a success. Around 100 people signed in: 60- visitors and 30 members. It is safe to say attendance was actually around 150 people or more. We had 5 dealers who all reported having a nice show and hope to be invited to return.
