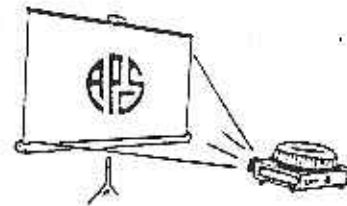

JANUARY PROGRAM

1991 U. S. STAMP PROGRAM

Because the new first class rate has yet to be announced, things are somewhat up in the air for the USPS. The following article is a review of what you can expect in the year ahead. Dates will be announced beginning with our February issue. Very few dates, places and denominations are anything but temporary at this time.

First of all, you can expect 50 less stamps because the USPS is delaying the wildflower sheet until the spring of 1992. This sheet was not going to be available in time for spring of this year. This reduces the number from 112 to 62, but this is not written in stone either.

January will see the issue of two stamps to cover the bases until the stamps with the proper denominations can be prepared. The rate is to be announced the first week in January with the new rate to be effective February 3rd (maybe). So the new non-denominated "F" stamp, featuring a tulip (flower); and the "makeup" stamp will be issued this month.

The "makeup" stamp is an interesting innovation, sure to attract philatelic comment. It is to be used with 25¢ stamps to "makeup" the difference between the old and new rates. It will not have any graphic - only text. It will be invalid for use on international mail like the other non-denominated issues. It will also not have phosphorescent tagging.

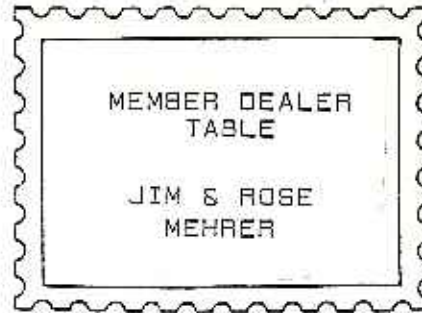

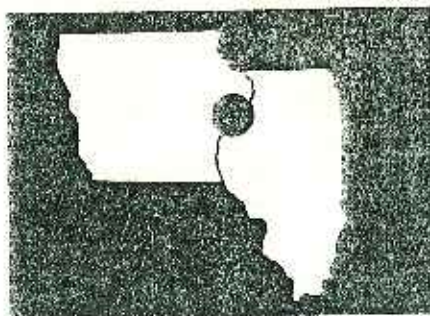
