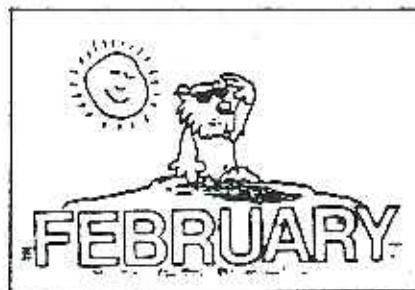

PHILA-QUAD EDITOR

Several people have asked just what would be required of them should they consider writing our monthly newsletter. Some expect there is actually more to the job than there is. So, hoping not to scare anyone off, I thought it would be a good idea to give you some insight into the process.

The actual job of writing begins about two weeks before the meeting. It depends on who will be doing the mailing and when, as well as arranging to get the prepared newsletter to the printer and back. A certain number of phone calls are needed to get information. George Wolters types and submits the auction so just a few lines need to be added to that page. The editor is a non-voting member of the Board of Directors and should attend their meetings each month to obtain information. The gathered information is then written - including paste-ups of earlier ads, officers lists, etc. After it is finished, the newsletter is sent or taken to the printer. When it is finished it is delivered or picked up as the situation requires. Sometimes the editor does some or all of the collating, but that is actually the job of the person who will be doing the mailing.

That's all there is to it. You write whatever you have using your judgement and the Board's as to what the Club should know. The only thing that must be in each issue is the auction list. Special illustrations are just something I enjoy adding and are certainly not required. Just tell us what we need to know each month. I have a list of the basics needed on a month to month basis and will write up layout information for the new editor if he or she needs it.

Please consider the job. I have enjoyed it, but it is time to move on to other things...
