was returned to the Club treasury the \$24.80 used to send letters and receipt slips to the auction donors. This leaves us with a balance on hand of \$16.81 toward the expenses for next year. This money will be deposited in the checking account until it is needed for future expenses.

Expenses for the 1991 auction were as follows: \$26.00 for letters sent before auction, \$10.50 for computer ribbon and \$24.80 for follow-up letters. Two large mailings to a 500 person mailing list were sent by the American Cancer Society.

We look forward to our 15th "STAMP OUT CANCER AUCTION" in the Spring of 1992 - the date and location yet to be announced.

If you do not have an entry, we may request your assistance as a judge for categories A thru D. Your participation on any level will help make this event a success.

2. Exhibitors may enter as many different categories as desired.
3. Judging will be by popular vote or by a judging panel, as appropriate.
4. An award will be given in each category.

6. Enter your exhibit the evening of MAY 9TH prior to 8 p.m.

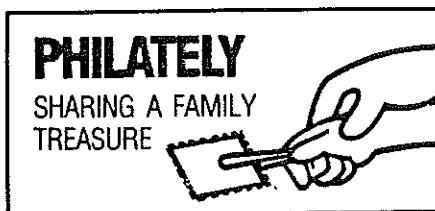

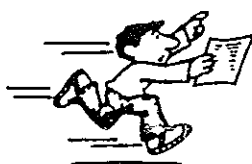
