BASKETBALL

The centenary of the American sport of basketball has been celebrated with one US stamp this year and new issues in other countries. The game was invented by Dr. James Naismith, a Canadian, who was teaching college in Springfield, MA. Canada is recognizing there native son and his invention of basketball with a Souvenir Sheet and a commorative stamp, both issued October 25, 1991. The first game using Dr. Naismith's rules was played December 21, 1891.

"STAMP OUT CANCER AUCTION"

Anyone who has been involved with the "Stamp Out Cancer Auction" has received an initial mailing from the American Cancer Society. You should have received it in December. For those "Newcomers" this 15th annual philatelic auction has raised \$65,000.00 for the ACS. Although stamp auctions are not new, our club holds one every month, this auction is unique in that it is the only one devoted to the American Cancer Society with all proceeds given to the Society.

Where does the stamp/philatelic material come from? you may ask. It comes from your donations and hopefully many others! Do you get anything in return? If you believe in *helping others*, that is one reward, if it is *working for a good cause*, that is another, if it is a tax deduction, it is that also but only for the amount realized, for your donation, from the auction. If you want to attend and bid this is another way of contributing to the cause. In fewer words, What you put into it is what you will receive as a reward.

All philatelic donations are accepted and appreciated; however, would you want to see an auction of poor quality, torn and damaged "space-fillers"? Very few collectors do so we request that the material be, at the least, sound. The cutoff date is FEBRUARY 29! This will provide adequate time for advertising and a more complete auction list. For bulk material like Scott catalogs older than 3 years, which can make interesting door-stops but generate little interest, you can bring them on the day of the auction and they will be accommodated. Other types of philatelic literature are appreciated, such as speciality catalogs, which may be out of print, but 10 years of the American Philatelist? Bring them to the auction, so we don't have to store and lug them around ourselves. It just may be what someone is looking for.

So where is this "Stamp Out Cancer Auction"? It is going to be held SUNDAY, MARCH 22, 1992, at the FORT ARMSTRONG HOTEL, in downtown ROCK ISLAND, IL. Viewing will begin at 11:00 a.m. and the auction will begin at 1:00 p.m. Depending on the number of lots and spirited bidding the auction should end about 4:00 p.m. Donations can be mailed to the QUAD CITY STAMP CLUB, P.O. BOX 10301, MOLINE IL 61265-9301. The committee chairman is Donald E. Hayes and he has most of the answers.
