YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

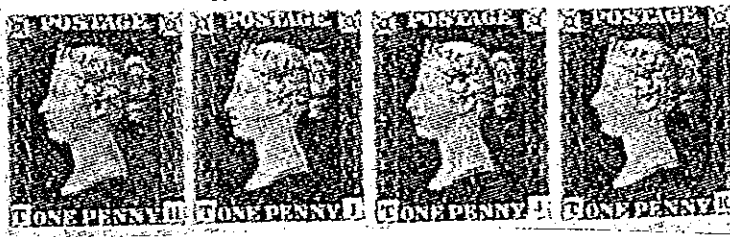
