## *Stamp Club Sponsors Cancer Benefit Stamp Auction*

For the past 16 years the Quad City Stamp Club has sponsored an auction of donated stamps with the total proceeds going to local American Cancer Society Chapters.

The idea for a benefit called *Stamp-Out Cancer Auction* was suggested and formulated by the late Richard F. Castner, Jr. and his wife Jane. Dick served as Chairman for the event for the first ten years. Records show the Castners solicited donations from friends and customers of their Bettendorf Stamp store called *River City Stamps*. They also wrote publicity releases for papers and secured a generous and attractive place to hold the auction, the Jumer's Castle Lodge in Bettendorf, Iowa. The result of publicity releases in major philatelic publications was generous from all parts of the United States and also several foreign countries.

The first auction was held in 1978 with 268 lots and 66 bidders. The range of bids brought .25 to \$90.00 with an average income of \$6.53 per lot and a total income of \$1750.00. Probably the most expensive lot was a mint copy of C15 which sold for \$725 in 1982. Over the ten years that Dick Castner managed the auction a total of \$47,712 was realized to fight cancer. That 1982 auction brought a total of \$7,200 which was presented to local American Cancer Society Chapters.

After ten years of managing the Cancer auction Mr. Castner was stricken with cancer himself and he turned to the Quad City Stamp Club to take over his dream benefit. The club agreed to sponsor the event and Mr. Don Hayes of Moline, Illinois consented to become the new chair for the event.

Since 1988 auction lists have been computerized. This list has also been used to produce prices realized lists. Current mailing lists include almost 800 persons and businesses in the United States, Canada, Germany, and Austria. Since 1988, \$23,306 has been donated to the Cancer Society. The event has been moved from Jumer's Castle Lodge to the Fort Armstrong Hotel and in 1993 was housed in the Sheaton Inn, Rock Island, Illinois.

Even now the plans are being made for the 1994 Quad City Stamp Club Cancer Stamp Auction. Jumer's Castle Lodge in Bettendorf will once again be the site for the auction. The event will be held on March 20, 1994 and donations of philatelic materials will be gratefully received. If you would like more information contact Mr. Don Hayes, Quad City Stamp Club, P.O.
