An item from the Philatelic Press SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL STAMP STORE (If you are lucky enough to have one!)

Nationwide, there are fewer than 300 full time "store front" stamp stores. That's fewer than 6 per state. These brave souls deserve support from the local and area stamp collectors.

Sure, a buck or two may be saved on the purchase of supplies, albums and catalogs from national discount houses - they operate on a very large volume and can still make a small profit. But, what about the personal touch the local stamp dealer provides, as well as immediate delivery of in-stock merchandise. And don't forget the friendly smile and a little chit-chat. For the local, if the rent doesn't get paid and the telephone bill covered - out of business they'll go. And then there is no local availability for supplies and stamps.

Ah yes! The stamps! We all know the importance of condition when buying those little gems in our collection. If a collector orders through the mail, it is sight-unseen, having to depend on the mail order dealer's description, such as "fine to very fine". Your definition may be entirely different than his. Beauty is in the eye of the beholder, and what collector doesn't like to not only see, but hold in their hands (or tongs) the stamp that is being considered for their collection before laying down the cash.

In the '50's and '60's and before, there were many more stamp dealers around for a collector to shop. Because of higher operating (and living) costs, plus the great expansion of mail order houses, store front stamp dealers are becoming a scare species. Lets keep them around.

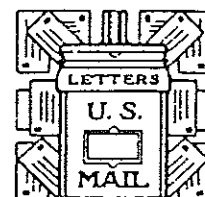

Cletus and Mary Simon have joined Steve in the mailing process in recent years. Their aim is always to mail from a different town or a least from a town with a different precancel device that has been used before. After 40 years of mailings, achieving this variety remains a top priority.

There is a large amount of behind the scenes work needed to get the *PHILAQUAD* to you each month. This ranges from asking Postmasters to obtain precancellers for us to use to mail the bulletins right on schedule so they arrive Monday before our meeting. Several issues of the *PHILAQUAD* have been mailed from towns that no longer have post offices.
